Attendance-optional classes are held at our learning center facility, which borders both Russian Gulch State Park and Jackson Demonstration State Forest near the scenic coastal village of Caspar, California. Three full-time certificated teachers and one or more aides serve some 40 students in Kindergarten through fifth grade. The program features multi-age, small-group learning, interactive learning with peers and staff, project-based learning, developmentally appropriate use of technology, active involvement of parents and other community members, and incorporates the natural habitat provided by the learning center's unique setting adjacent to a state park. A Parent Advisory Council is responsible for local decision-making.

Our mission is to prepare students to be socially literate, to calculate and think logically, and to read, write, and speak clearly. Students will be taught respect for the earth and encouraged to become life-long learners engaged in community life.

Position Summary:

Teachers embrace the CCLC philosophy, and hold the primary responsibility for the development and implementation of instruction, and for the learning success of CCLC students. **Teacher Responsibilities:**

- Support the school's mission, philosophies, values, goals, and policies toward students, parents/guardians and coworkers.
- Interact frequently and respectfully with children and parents.
- Design and effectively deliver engaging and developmentally appropriate curriculum/instruction tailored to the needs and strengths of individual children.
- Establish a nurturing family-like classroom environment that fully engages the children in hands-on, collaborative and project-based learning.
- Create a positive and non-competitive educational and social climate.
- Actively support children's social and emotional development, including teaching and practicing conflict resolution skills.
- Assess students' progress primarily through direct observation and collaboration rather than through graded testing.
- Work closely and collaborate with fellow teachers to address the needs of children and to achieve a continuum of learning from grade to grade.
- Facilitate ongoing parent/guardian communications and conferences to discuss student progress/development.
- Set clear short-term and long-term individual goals to drive instruction.
- Work with parents to create the best possible experience for each child
- Welcome and encourage parent volunteers in the classroom.
- Collaborate with the Special Education staff to ensure that students receive appropriate accommodations and support.
- Implement classroom management practices that are consistent with the existing culture of the program.
- Attend monthly Parent Advisory Board Meetings.
- Attend weekly transition meetings with the board's designated representative(s).
- Maintain an organized, attractive and safe learning environment.
- Uphold all school policies and procedures.
- Submit learning logs and enrollment paperwork to Mattole Valley Charter School in a timely manner.
